### School Improvement News

As part of Kincardine O'Neil School's Improvement Planning, three priorities have been identified for this 2022-2023 session.

**Priority 1:** To continue to improve teaching, learning and assessment approaches.

**Priority 2:** To increase attainment in writing across the school.

Priority 3: To increase pupil participation and engagement.

Staff have been working on improving teaching, learning and assessment and exploring how to involve pupils further in whole school initiatives during our staff meetings. During our November in-service training we will be travelling to Laurencekirk to receive "Big Writing" training and further explore how we are teaching.

#### Seesaw



As you are aware, this year at Kincardine O'Neil School we are going to use an online app called Seesaw to share our learning. Seesaw is a simple way for teachers and students to record and share what's happening in the classroom. We have already seen some fantastic learning being shared by pupils with families at home.

The pupils love receiving positive feedback on their learning from family members, as well as teachers. To do this at home, you can use the 'like' and 'comment' features on Seesaw posts.

#### Pantomime Trip

On Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> December we will all be going to His Majesty's Theatre in Aberdeen to see this year's Christmas Pantomime, 'Peter Pan'. We will be leaving after an early lunch. A drink and snack will be provided whilst at the Pantomime. A big thank you to Kincardine O'Neil Parent Council who have paid for transport to and from the show.



#### Primary 6-7 Residential Trip

We are delighted that we have been able to organise a residential trip for our P6-7 pupils this session. On Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> May, pupils will be going on their residential trip to Abernethy for 3 nights along with pupils from Lumphanan School. During their trip they will have the opportunity to participate in lots of exciting outdoor activities such as abseiling, canoeing, archery and ziplining.
